

Visit Basilicata in New York

The celebration of Lucanian culture around the world continues all month long. In New York City there are exhibitions and events at the John D. Calandra Italian American Institute that highlight the Region.

Visitors to the Calandra Institute can explore "BASILICATË: A Celebration of Lucanian Culture in the World." The exhibition examines emigration from Basilicata to Argentina, the United States, and Uruguay. Featuring a unique design using cardboard moving boxes to symbolize the migration process, it highlights four aspects of the Lucanian culture: language, cuisine, domestic spaces, and religious rituals. The project is transnational with additional exhibitions in Buenos Aires, Montevideo, and Turin running concurrently.

The exhibition in New York was made possible by the collaboration of several public and private organizations including, the Federazione Circoli e Associazioni dei Lucani in Piemonte, the Basilicata Region, the Centro dei Lucani nel Mondo Nino Calice, the Architecture of Shame group, Federazione Lucana d'America and other Associations of Lucanians in United States, Carlo's Bakery, Eataly, Enoteca Regionale Lucania and the John D. Calandra Italian American Institute.

The Calandra institute has several separate events scheduled to complement the Exhibition:

• Monday, September 9, 6pm—Roundtable Discussion:

Three Creative Women: Penny Arcade, Joanna Clapps Herman, and Helene Stapinski. Three women artists with roots in Basilicata gather to discuss their work and shared origins.

- Wednesday, September 18, 6pm—Rocco Scotellaro's Transnational Basilicata, by Isabella Livorni of New York University. In this talk, Isabella Livorni will analyze how Scotellaro conceived of the connections between Basilicata and other parts of the world in his poetry and creative writing.
- Wednesday, October 9, 6pm—Il mondo è troppo per me: La storia di Vittorio Camardese ("The world is too much for me: The story of Vittorio Camardese"). This film tells the story of Vittorio Camardese, a guitarist from Basilicata, who presaged techniques of both jazz and rock music.



Museum of Lucanian Emigration

Museo dell'emigrazione lucana

The <u>Museum of Lucanian Emigration</u> is now open at the Lagopesole Castle. The opening was announced by Mimì Coviello, Coordinatrice del Comitato Tecnico Scientifico in a message saying,

"Dear Lucanians,

I am thrilled to announce that, starting August 15, 2024, Lagopesole Castle and the Museum of Lucanian Emigration, located at the Nino Calice Centro dei Lucani nel Mondo, will once again be open to visitors. This achievement was made possible through my personal commitment, the invaluable support of the Ufficio Politiche per i Sistemi Culturali Turistici, the collaboration of the Basilicata Region, and the dedicated efforts of President Vito Bardi. We also received crucial cooperation from various organizations, including the Museums and Archaeological Parks of Melfi and Venosa, the State Property Agency of Puglia and Basilicata, and the Municipality of Avigliano.

What once seemed impossible has now become a reality, and with this renewed confidence and optimism, we will continue to move forward in the coming months.

I sincerely hope that those of you who will be in Basilicata in the coming weeks, whether for vacation or as part of the Roots Tourism project by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, will have the opportunity to visit Lagopesole and the Museum of Lucanian Emigration.

The museum's layout reconstructs and tells, through the use of multimedia and interactive technologies such as video, seat sensors, and multi-touch screens, the stages and experiences of the migrants' journey on wagons, trains and ships, and their landing in a foreign land, Ellis Island in particular. The Museum exhibits photographs, objects, letters, documents and memories that accompany you on this journey into the memory of Lucanian emigration.











